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## Pocketful of Posies Bracelet

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


### Materials:

- Peanut beads 2x4mm, Light Sage Luster, Item #P4013-TB
- 11° seed bead, Metallic Gold Iris, Item #11-9462-TB
- 15° seed bead, Matte Metallic Gold, Item# 15-92006-TB
- Beading thread, 6lb test Fireline
- Size 12 or 13 Beading needles


Pretty, feminine and as sweet as Spring, this bracelet uses peanut beads to create a softly textured chain of blossoms with a perfectly integrated beaded toggle clasp. Make it to fit any size wrist by adding or subtracting motifs.

This pattern can be made by intermediate beaders or determined beginners; if you're just starting out, you'll probably want some help. If you've already worked with seed beads, and are comfortable following directions and diagrams, then this pattern is for you!



### Step 1:

- On 3' of thread, string (12) 11° beads, leaving a 6-8 inch tail.
- Go through all of the beads again to form a circle.
- Go through the first 11° bead once more.



**Step 2:**


String (3) peanut beads.  
Go through the 11° bead you started from.  
Go through the next 11° bead in the circle.

**Tip:**


Keep your tension tight and adjust the beads after each step.

**Step 3:**

String (2) peanut beads, and go through the first peanut bead added in the previous step.  
Go through the 11° bead you started from and the next 11° bead in the circle.




The peanut beads should fit together tightly so that all you see are their round sides.



**Step 4:**

Repeat Step 3 around the circle until you have 11 peanut beads on the outside edge of the motif.  
Go through the last peanut bead added in Step 2.





**Step 5:**

Pick up (1) peanut beads and go through the first peanut bead added in the previous step.  
Go through the 11° bead from step 4, the next 11° bead in the circle, and up through the peanut beads as shown in the diagram.

**Step 6:**

Pick up (2) 15°s, (3) 11°s and (2) 15°s.  
Go through the peanut bead you started from, pick up (2) 15°s and go through the next peanut bead. Keep your tension tight; the 11° in the center of the loop should make a point.





**Step 7:**

Repeat Step 6 around the circle until you have added a petal to each peanut bead.  
Take your thread around the circle of peanut beads and (2) 15°s as shown in the diagram to firm up the work, but do not finish off the thread.  
Make another motif, following Steps 1-7.

**Step 8:**

Working on the back, pick up (15) 15° beads. Go through the peanut bead on the back of the second motif.  
Pick up (15) 15° beads and go through the peanut bead you started from.  
Go through the next (2) 15° beads and the next peanut bead on the circle.





### Step 9:


Working on the back, pick up (15) 11° beads. Go through the bead work on the back of the second motif, as shown.

Pick up (15) 11° beads and go through the bead work on the back of the first motif, as shown.

Repeat the thread path from Steps 8-9, and finish off the thread. Finish off the tail thread.

### Step 10:

On 3' of thread, string (11) peanut beads and (1) 11° bead, leaving a 6-8 inch tail. Skip the 11° bead and go back through the (11) peanut beads. Pull the thread tight, and arrange them as shown in the diagram.



### Step 11:

Pick up (1) 11° bead and go through (6) peanut beads, coming out the center bead of the toggle.

Pick up (25) 15° beads and go through the middle peanut bead of the motif, as shown.

Pick up (15) 15° beads, count down (10) 15°s from the toggle, and go through those (10) 15° beads, heading towards the toggle. Go through the center peanut bead on the toggle and go back down through (8) 15° beads.




### Step 12:

Pick up (15) 11° beads, and go through the beads on the circle, as shown.

Pick up (15) 11° beads, and go through (2) 15°s, as shown.

Repeat the rest of the thread path from Steps 11-12, and finish off the thread.

Take the tail thread through the toggle bar 1-2 times and finish it off.



Continue adding motifs (Steps 1-9) until the bracelet is the desired length. Pull the toggle through the last circle to close the bracelet.



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
